

Little Blue Riding Hood Scarf

Skill Level: Easy

Materials: 300 yards of Red Heart Super Saver in Light Blue (381)
- Substitute with any medium worsted (4) weight yarn.

Crochet Hook: 5.0mm [US-H]

Finished Measurements: 8" wide x 46" long.

Gauge: 2" = 7 DCs and 4 rows

**Gauge is not important unless you want the same size project as pictured.
Use any size hook to obtain the gauge if needed.**

Note: You can alter the size of the scarf by adding or subtracting the needed stitches on the beginning chain to get the desired length, and if you need it wider, simply add more rows until you have the desired width.

CH 167

Row 1: Beginning in 4th CH from hook, DC in each ST across. 165 STS

Note: To create a nice edge, work this first row in the bottom bump of your foundation chain.

Row 2: Turn, CH 3 (counts as first DC). In next ST, DC in **back loop only**, DC in every **back loop only** stitch across. 165 STS

Row 3-16: Repeat **Row 2**. 165 STS
At the end of **Row 16**, fasten off and weave in ends.

Making Hood

Fold scarf in half, then join your yarn with a SL ST on the foundation chain side of scarf. Using an SC join, connect the top 8" of scarf together, then fasten off and weave in ends.

The steps to complete a SC stitch join:

With a loop on your hook, insert hook through both layers you need to join, YO, pull up through work (now two loops on hook), YO, pull loop through two loops already on hook, Tighten.

Note: This is the only time when you want to tighten your stitches after you make each one. It will give you a tighter seam.

Abbreviations Used:

CH: chain; DC: double crochet; ST(S): stitch(es); SL ST: slip stitch; SC: single crochet; YO: yarn over
