



# STUMPY THE UNICORN



DESIGNED BY DEJA JOY

**Skill Level:** Advanced Beginner

**Materials:**

- approx 175 yards of Lion Brand in Baby Soft in Crisp White (920-100) CA
- scraps of Lion Brand Baby Soft in Petal (920-104M) CB,
- scraps of Lion Brand Homespun in Aster CC.
- Small amount of polyfill
- 2- 6mm Black Safety Eyes (if child playing with this is under 3, stitch the eyes on instead of using plastic eyes)

- yarn or tapestry needle

**Crochet Hook:** 4mm [US-F]

**Gauge:** 2" = 9 SCs, and 10 rows

**Finished Measurements:** Approx. 7" long x 5" high

**Special Note on Pattern:**

- Read through pattern before beginning.
- The rounds are worked in spirals, you will not join after each round.



## Body Instructions

Legs (make 4)

With **CB**, CH 2.

**RND 1:** Beginning in 2nd chain from hook, SC 6 times. 6 STS (You can substitute with a magic adjustable ring on **RND 1** if you prefer)

**RND 2:** SC 2 times in each SC around. 12 STS

**RND 3:** [SC 2 times in next SC, SC in next SC] 6 times. 18 STS

**RND 4:** SC in each SC around. 18 STS

**RND 5:** Repeat **RND 4**. 18 STS

**RND 6:** Repeat **RND 4**, at the last stitch of this RND, join **CA** and fasten off **CB**. **Note:** To do this perform your last SC, but stop at your last YO. Use **CA** instead of **CB** for last YO and pull through last SC to join. 18 STS

**RNDs 7-11:** Repeat **RND 4**. 18 STS

**RND 12:** Repeat **RND 4**.

### Finishing the Legs

At end of RND, leave hook on loop, stuff polyfill stiffly in the hoof and loose in the leg. Then you will hold the two sides together and use a SL ST join to close the hole. Do this by inserting your hook through the next ST of both sides of leg, YO, pull through both sides and through loop on your hook.

Repeat across then fasten off, but be sure to leave a tail about 6 inches long to sew the legs to the body later.

### Body

With **CB**, CH 2.

**RND 1:** Beginning in 2nd chain from hook, SC 6 times. 6 STS (You can substitute with a magic adjustable ring on **RND 1** if you prefer)

**RND 2:** SC 2 times in each SC around. 12 STS

**RND 3:** [SC 2 times in next SC, SC] 6 times. 18 STS

**RND 4:** [SC 2 times in next SC, SC in next 2 SC] 6 times. 24 STS

**RND 5:** [SC 2 times in next SC, SC in next 3 SC] 6 times. 30 STS

**RND 6:** [SC 2 times in next SC, SC in next 4 SC] 6 times. 36 STS

**RND 7:** SC in each SC around. 36 STS

**RNDs 8-22:** Repeat **RND 7**. 36 STS

### Attach Legs

Using your tails from each leg, place each leg on underside of body and weave the tail in between the body and leg all the way across, securing the leg to the body. There is no right or wrong way to do it, just do it so it looks neat and it is secure. I ran the tail through a ST on the leg then ran it through the body and back out to the next ST. Attach the legs between **RNDs 8-22**.

**RND 23:** [SC2TOG, SC in next 4 SC] 6 times. 30 STS

**RND 24:** [SC2TOG, SC in next 3 SC] 6 times. 24 STS

**RND 25:** [SC2TOG, SC in next 2 SC] 6 times. 18 STS

**RND 26:** [SC2TOG, SC in next SC] 6 times. 12 STS  
Stuff body to desired stiffness.

**RND 27:** [SC2TOG] 6 times. 6 STS

Cut a tail about 6 inches long and weave it in and out of each of the remaining 6 STS then pull tight to close the hole completely. Weave in end.

### Head

With **CB**, CH 2.

**RND 1:** Beginning in 2nd chain from hook, SC 6 times. 6 STS (You can substitute with a magic adjustable ring on **RND 1** if you prefer)

**RND 2:** SC 2 times in each SC around. 12 STS

**Rnd 3:** [SC 2 times in next SC, SC] 6 times. 18 STS

**RND 4:** [SC 2 times in next SC, SC in next 2 SC] 6 times. 24 STS

**RND 5:** SC in each SC around. 24 STS

**RNDs 6-12:** Repeat **RND 5**. 24 STS

**RND 13:** [2 SC in next SC] 6 times. SC in next 18 STS. 30 STS



**RND 14:** SC in each SC around. 30 STS

**RNDs 15-21:** Repeat **RND 14**. 30 STS

## Attach eyes

Following safety eye instructions place them on **RND 13** with 5 SCs in between them if you like the look of the pictured Stumpy. Otherwise place them as far apart as you like. See pictures below for further help.

**RND 22:** [SC2TOG, SC in next 3 SC] 6 times. 24 STS

**RND 23:** [SC2TOG, SC in next 2 SC] 6 times. 18 STS

**RND 24:** [SC2TOG, SC in next SC] 6 times. 12 STS

Stuff head to desired stiffness.

**RND 25:** [SC2TOG] 6 times. 6 STS

Cut a long tail about and weave it in and out of each of the remaining 6 STS then pull tight to close the hole completely. Do not weave in end. You will use it to sew head to body.

## Unicorn Horn

With **CB**, CH 2.

**RND 1:** Beginning in 2nd chain from hook, SC 3 times. 3 STS (You can substitute with a magic adjustable ring on **RND 1** if you prefer)

Continue SC around the three stitches until the horn reaches 1 inch. Cut a tail a few inches long and attach to the head in the same fashion as the legs. Place horn about 4 rows above the eyes directly in the center.

### Abbreviations Used:

**CH**- chain

**CA(B,C)**- color A(B,C)

**SC**- single crochet

**SC2TOG** - single crochet 2 together

**RND**- round

**SL ST**- slip stitch

**ST(S)**- stitch(es)

**YO** - yarn over

**[...] x times**- stitch repeat, work the stitches contained within the brackets the amount of times as stated directly after the brackets.

## Attach Head

Use tail to attach head to body the same way as the legs and horn. Place head 6 rows up from the center hole at the front of the body.

## Tail

Cut pieces of 5 inch lengths of **CC** yarn. Fold strands in half, creating loop, pull loop through stitch at tail position. Put ends through loop and pull to tighten. If it is too hard to do all 10 pieces together, then do them in smaller amounts.

## Mane

Cut pieces of 10 inch lengths of **CC** for mane and pieces of 5 inch lengths of **CC** for bangs. Use the same method as tail but only use one strand per stitch. Insert bang pieces four stitches wide (as in one strand on each stitch and they will be all next to each other four stitches wide) one row above the horn. Cut to desired length.

Next, start one row back from bangs and using four stitches wide method, continue adding one strand to each stitch in a Mohawk like pattern down the back of the head. See picture below of hair held back.
